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Midlands Workforce Business Service Team Charter and Engagement Plan

Team Purpose

The Midlands Workforce system Business/Employer Service Team (BEST) formalizes the commitment of the consortium of partners that serve the Midlands (Workforce Development Area) business & employers. The BEST serves as the mechanism to organize resources in an efficient delivery system that represents the SC Works brand as a unified organization that provides services to Midlands employers and businesses.

Background

The SC Works Certification Standards for Business Services call for a fully integrated, multiagency business services team comprised of representatives from each of the federally mandated partners. This charter formalizes the commitment to function as a well managed, unified team in order to meet this mandate. Representation of Business Services by BEST members will operate under the banner of SC Works, promoting the brand not just an individual agency or program.

Scope

The SC Works System is focused on understanding business needs and has an effective approach for meeting those needs. It plays a key role in assisting with regional economic development by aligning resources with economic development and education partners. Service delivery strategies are based on the workforce needs of employers.

Team composition

The Midlands Workforce Development Area will appoint a lead to manage the Business Services Team and be the point of contact for regional economic development and business service initiatives. Federally-mandated partners who provide services to business & employers will be engaged to actively participate on the BEST. Additional partners who provide relevant services to business will be engaged where applicable and when possible. The BEST will also have representation from secondary and post-secondary education and training partners.

Team Operations

The BEST will meet regularly, at least quarterly, or as needed, to ensure open communication and education of team members and center staff. All efforts will be made to ensure Team members have up-to-date contact information and a direct path of communication with all Team members. Referrals between Team members and partners should be documented and reported out to the BEST Team Leader at least monthly.

To accomplish a successful team approach, the signing member agrees that:

- The team will target services to all Midlands businesses with a focus on sectors identified by Midlands Workforce Development Board and the LWDB Strategic Plan to achieve the most efficient use of resources.
- All team members will be trained on partner services, programs and goals.
- Team members will identify themselves to businesses as workforce system representatives, presenting the full range of relevant services to businesses.
- There will be consistent, real time communication between the members of the BEST.
- The team will track delivery of services in SCWOS against SWDB/LWDBs expected performance. This will include use of the Customer Relationship Module or other access as appropriate.
- Businesses will be consulted for input on critical success factors. The Business Services
 Team will be Industry & Sector focused. All team members will report to the Team
 Leader any issues, related to a particular industry or sector and the Team Leader will
 seek internal and external resources to resolve any issues.
- The team will ensure that all SC Works staff and partners recognize businesses as a customer and know where to send them for assistance. SC Works staff will be apprised of training needs of employers and will be notified when training and hiring needs change.

Engagement Plan

The Midlands BST Engagement Plan section is intended to be an outline for operational efficiency and to eliminate duplication. It is not meant to be a rigid procedural guide or checklist for staff.
